Working closely with CSSC the CSAA are seeking to encourage participation within the grass roots of the sport by providing entry fee subsidies for a series of local races, with an initial pilot in 2008 of 4 races.

THE CSAA is an elected body and the Committee meets three times a year to discuss matters relating to the forthcoming events. The AGM is held in January to which all members are welcome to attend. There are places on the Committee for anyone who is genuinely interested in contributing to the CSAA. However, if you are prepared to assist at any of our Championship Meetings without the responsibility of becoming a Committee Member we would welcome that as well. 3. Queenborough Events Review 2007

3.1 Cross Campus Challenge Loughborough

The Cross Campus Challenge replaced the traditional 10k when the Loughborough Campus roads could not be closed for the duration of the race. With a mix of track, road and fields this 6m race provided a testing course for the athletes who ran but unfortunately numbers were down on previous years. Whether this was because it was part of the CSSC Games or away from the traditional London venue was difficult to gauge. However, the London Marathon 3 days later did take away anywhere between 15 – 20 of the usual athletes. The feedback from competitors was good and it was pleasing to see new Departments, such as Land Registry, enjoying the event and some success.

3.2 Track & Field Bedford

The 132nd CSAA Championships were held at Bedford and were a well-organised and efficient event. Numbers were once again lower than expected and for the first time that anyone could remember there were no heats in any event, which meant some gaps in the timetable. The athletes appreciated the organisation and are very supportive of

It was also a pleasure to welcome the CSAA President Sir Anthony Battishill to the event and indeed to other events throughout the year.

The Queenborough Trophy for 2006/07 was once again won by RCSL with the Braben-Whiffen Trophy being awarded to GCHQ based on a formula related to improvement on the previous year by a small Department.

3.3 Masters Track & Field Battersea

Once again Gaye Clarke and John Hall organised another successful event which included the M35 Age-Group for the first time. The turnout was high, the competition keen and one or two event records were set.

3.4 Race Walk Birmingham

With 16 Men and 7 Women this was another good turnout for the CSAA Race Walk. The Men covered a distance of 10k whilst the Women's Race was 5k. Maureen Noel won for the third year in a row whilst Dwayne Butterley prevented Dave Turner completing his hat trick. New walkers are always welcome at this event with novice awards being presented and help is always on hand for anyone genuinely interested in learning more about the skills of race walking.

4.2 Ryan Cup (Race Walking) CS v Police

The Civil Service Team regained the Ryan Cup by the overwhelming margin of 40 points against the Police. The match was incorporated within the CSAA Championships and the Police Championships, which meant more walkers and a higher standard all round. Feedback was for this to continue in the future.

5 Other Athletic Achievements

The CSAA has a number of very talented athletes who have achieved international honours and are highly placed in the 2007 National Rankings for their events at both Open and Masters levels. This is a credit to the athletic talent within the Civil Service but special mention must go to HASSRA athlete Hattie Dean who was 15th in the World Cross Country Championships, broke the British 3000m Steeplechase Record 3 times and won team gold in the European Cross Country Championships.

Whilst the honours always go the best performers, the CSAA also likes to acknowledge the achievements of all our athletes and that includes those who run for fitness and fun, and especially those who organise events within or outside the Civil Service. Without these people the sport could not continue and the Committee are looking at ways to increase the opportunities for these athletes to take part in Civil Service events at both Local and National level.

6 CSAA Whole Sport Plan

After a great deal of work the CSAA Whole Sport Plan was accepted and approved by the Sports and Leisure Committee. Whilst maintaining the traditional Championship Events, CSSC has also agreed to provide financial assistance with a planned trip to The Hague in March 2008 to compete with colleagues from the Dutch Civil Service. The other major step forward is the introduction of a Race Subsidy Scheme where CSSC Members who participate in any of the four nominated races will receive a refund of 50% on their entry fee. This scheme is aimed mainly at the local grassroots runner who would not normally take part in a Championship event. If this proves a success it could be expanded further in 2009.

7 Thanks and Recognitions

A special vote of thanks must go to all those who took on the task of organising a Championship event. We are always grateful to all the Departmental Team Managers and Sports Association officials who chase and coerce athletes to participate, as without them we would not have any events. It is particularly pleasing to see the small Departments supporting the Championships. For example, Land Registry have enjoyed the events throughout 2007 and appreciated the opportunity to compete with fellow athletes from across the country.

During the 2007 the following Committee Members have received recognition for their services to CSSC athletics. Dave Evans has been given a CSSC Merit Award in recognition of the tremendous amount of work he has down for CSAA, IRSA & RCSL. Dave also received the Trophy for Best Sport Section Organiser for his role as Team Manager of the RCSL Athletic Club. Bill Berry, who is retiring as Treasurer, after 20 years service, received a letter of commendation from CSSC, whilst Nick Hume was awarded a Certificate of Recognition for his services to athletics by the North West CSSC.

The CSAA are always grateful for the help and assistance provided by CSSC staff during the year and we look forward to the new road subsidy scheme planned for 2008.

Finally as always I must pay tribute to the CSAA Committee who are a very professional and hard working body dedicated to the sport of athletics and promoting it within the Civil Service.
