1 CSAA Aims and Objectives

The CSAA aims to encourage active participation in athletics amongst all Civil Servants, men and women, who are members of the Civil Service Sports Council. The Association's Committee acts on this remit by organising an annual series of national championship events, and also entering representative teams in matches against the RAF, the Police and the Fire Service. As part of its wider involvement in Civil Service athletics the Committee maintains links with Regional and Departmental Organisers in an attempt to ensure that events are run to a high standard and that participation records are maintained to illustrate the numbers taking part.

The Whole Sport Plan for 2013 reiterates the main principles for CSAA:

"During the last couple of years the focus of how events are promoted by CSAA has changed and the focus on the Queenborough Trophy and Championships is being replaced by activity challenges over different distances and terrain. This focus of attention reflects the growing trend towards Health and Fitness initiatives within the work place and CSAA are keen to encourage grassroots participation and to build upon the legacy left by the Olympic Games and 'inspire a new generation of athletes'. Working with CSSC, CSAA believe that in 2013 this can be achieved, despite the cutbacks in the workplace."

The Table below highlights the participation levels over the last six years, where figures are available, and illustrates the great number of events that are now available to athletes within the Civil Service. These along with the CSSC Race Subsidy Scheme provide CSSC members with every opportunity to take part in Sport and increase their overall health and wellbeing which are seen as key areas by health and welfare organisations both within and outside of Government. The increase in members availing themselves of the subsidiary is highly encouraging and it would be nice to see more of them taking part in National and Regional events.

Once again CSAA provided a full programme of Championship events starting with the popular 10k Road Race in Battersea Park, London. This year a Diamond Jubilee event was also held in conjunction with CSSC which included a One Mile Walk and 3k Fun Run. It was a pleasure to welcome along as guest of honour the Patron of CSSC, the Duchess of Gloucester. She started the 10k Race and made a presentation to Sir Anthony as well as being introduced to members of the CSAA Committee and CSSC.

The Half Marathon Championships were once again incorporated within the Freckleton Half Marathon Race near Preston. This was another good day with a number of CSSC members making long journeys to compete for their teams. The main Track & Field Championships again saw a drop in numbers, even though the central location of Nuneaton, was ideal for transport links. The Master's Track and Field was a successful event but thought will be given to holding a combined Track and Field Championships for Open and Masters in 2013. The Race Walk Championships was well organised by the Police as it was held within the Ryan Cup event which CSAA retained.

The Road Relays is always a very enjoyable team event but numbers could be better, if more Departments supported it. However the numbers taking part remain consistent and Finsbury Park is an ideal venue. The final event of the year was the Cross Country at London's Parliament Hill which again hosted the HMRC & MoD Championships within the race. Numbers were down on 2011 as the

race had to be re-arranged at short notice due to a clash of dates and half term week meant that some athletes were away with families.

Overall the standard of competition remains high and is comparable to open events held week in and week out around the country. With even more pressure within the work place and on-going funding cuts CSAA strives to provide value for money throughout the year.

Thanks must go to Gerry Trainer, Ted Wingrove, Roger Smith, Gaye Clarke, Bob Brimage, Neil Hornsby, John Hall, Brian Craig and Nick Hume who all played major roles in the successful organisation of the events and all the other Committee Members who play their part in promoting athletics within the Civil Service.

At the 2012 CSSC Annual Conference the Hayward Trophy for Best SRB was awarded for 2011 to CSAA. This was the first time that a SRB had won the trophy three times which is recognition that CSAA continues to evolve with the times and moves forward positively in meeting the challenges imposed by budgetary cuts and the reduction in Civil Service numbers.

4 CSAA Whole Sports Plan 2012 and Outcomes

The Whole Sports Plan for 2012 identified the following Targets

 To encourage participation in athletic events against a cultural and financial stepchange within Government. The data maintained by CSAA during the last 4 - 5 years enables the CSAA Committee to monitor these changes upon our events and take proactive measures where possible.

Outcome: Despite cutbacks within the Civil Service numbers remain consistent and CSAA provides sufficient opportunities for athletes of all abilities to participate.

• To encourage CSSC to continue with the Half Marathon Subsidy Scheme introduced in 2009 which has proved very popular with CSSC members and the 10k Scheme introduced in 2011. The indications are that those who claim their refunds are a different participation group to those who regularly compete in CSAA Championships. That is they are not offered funding by their DA or Sports Body to participate in CSAA events during the working week.

Outcome: The Subsidy Scheme has gone from strength to strength but the challenge is to encourage these members to participate in the events organised by CSAA, Departments and Regions.

• To continue with the annual visit to Holland which provides an opportunity for any CSAA athlete to compete alongside Dutch Civil Servants which has certainly helped to promote inter-Departmental friendship within the UK and closer liaison with our Dutch European counter-parts. Also to continue to invite the Dutch to compete in the CSAA Cross Country Championships as they have done on a regular basis since 1995.

Outcome: The take up for this has fallen so will not be officially continued though members may make their own arrangements.

• To continue the links established with Scotland and Regional Race organisers in the North West, London and Yorkshire who actively promote athletic events;

Outcome: This has become more difficult for Regional Organisers as time and numbers have meant that some events have not been held or reduced fields have been seen.

• To provide advice and guidance to any other area which seeks to organise their own local Championships or any Department looking to host their own Championship within a CSAA event;

Outcome: MoD and HMRC have held successful Departmental Championships within the 10k and cross Country and other Departments would be supported if they wished to do so.

• To field full Representative Teams in the 2 Cross County Fixtures that have traditionally been supported by CSAA and one Track & Field Match.

Outcome: This has become more challenging to achieve as Middlesex have withdrawn from the Sefton-Brancker Trophy. Also the recent announcement regarding CSSC Representative Sport poses a number of interesting questions and debates.

• As a one-off for the 2012 Olympic Year CSAA have been invited to enter teams in the Green Belt Relay, which will hopefully start and finish in the Olympic Park and circles the M25. The event spans two days with teams of 11 or 12 runners (if a 2012 format is adopted with new route) running one stage each day. The event is organised by a Civil Servant who works for Jobcentre Plus within DWP and has been held for over 15 years. If CSAA are successful in securing funding for one or two teams to compete, it is proposed that runners seek sponsorship with donations going to an agreed Charity via a Just Giving WebPage. Further details are contained in Section 10 and the Budget Submission paper.

Outcome: CSSC decided not to provide funding for this event so it was not progressed.

5 Final Round-Up

Once again CSAA was proud to have a winner of one of the main CSSC awards when HMRC athlete Dave Long was presented with the Warren Fisher Trophy for Best Sportsman for 2011 at the 2012 Annual Conference.

A number of CSSC athletes gained representative honours at Senior and Master's level for Track and Field, Road Racing and even Fell Running.

CSAA continues to communicate with its athletes via the excellently maintained CSAA website at www.csaa.org.uk which provides information on all Queenborough events and Regional Championships where known plus results within a day or two of the event. The CSSC website provides a link to the CSAA website thus increasing the opportunity for new participants to become involved in one of the events. These channels are obviously successful as can be seen from the uptake of the CSSC Half Marathon and 10k Subsidy Schemes.

Finally I pay tribute to the hard working and dedicated Committee who give countless hours to ensuring that athletics events for Civil Servants are organised to the very highest standards with due consideration for the Health & Safety of all competitors. At all events Medical personnel are in attendance but fortunately are very rarely required to exercise their knowledge and skills. As volunteers much of the expertise within the Committee is also fed back into local athletic clubs, County and National Associations and/or by coaching or officiating at meetings up and down the country. Volunteers are the lifeblood of the Committee and without this dedication the CSAA would not be the vibrant Association that it continues to be and is fully prepared to meet the great challenges that are coming over the next few years. The assistance of the CSSC staff at events such as the 10k is always very welcome, whilst for other events local officials (England Athletics qualified) are only too happy to assist, as they know that CSAA events are well run and the offer of refreshments and travel expenses is always welcome!

In summary CSAA has maintained its long held traditions during a very challenging 2012, whilst continuing to adopt a flexible approach to changing situations within the Civil Service. The 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games have left a legacy which all sporting organisations are hoping will be a catalyst for increased participation and also a new influx of volunteers, but only time will tell if this hope is realised. However, CSAA is ready to welcome athletes of all abilities to its events and to
