THE incomparable Group Capt. Donald Finlay, the greatest British hurdler of all time, who last week won the R.A.F. 120 yards hurdles championship for the 15th time running, will take part in the triangular athletics match between Middlesex A.A.A., the R.A.F., and **Civil Service**, for the Sefton Brancker trophy at the R.A.F. Stadium, Uxbridge, next Wednesday evening.

Altogether there will be about twelve internationals on view including Len Eyre the Empire Games mile champion, high jumper Ron Pavitt, Michael Denley, javelin; Cross, the hop-step and jump champion; Giles, shot; N. McWhirter, 100 and 220 yds., and Land, discus.

This annual contest for the trophy includes a cross-country race which had already been run, and as a result the R.A.F. will start next Wednesday evening with a lead.

Before the actual events there will be a physical training display by the R.A.F. starting at 8.30.

Len Eyre (Leeds), the Empire three miles champion, was an outstanding winner for the **Civil Service** in the one mile event in the triangular **athletic** match between the **Civil Service**, Middlesex and the RAF for the Sefton Brancker Trophy at Uxbridge last night.

Eyre, in a field which included Peter Driver (Thames Valley and **Civil Service**), Doug Wilson, the British International, and O. Olding (Hornsey St. Mary's), won by three yards in 4 minutes 15.4 seconds.

It was a good time considering the heavy track conditions because of rain. The RAF won the trophy with 67 2-3 points.

JUST 25 years ago Air Marshal Sir Sefton Brancker was among several high ranking officials who lost their lives when the Airship R 101 crashed in France. He was a great sportsman and at the time of his death was President of the Middlesex County, R.A.F., and Civil Service Athletic Associations. To perpetuate his memory the three organizations jointly put up a trophy to be competed for annually. Normally the track and field athletics match is held at the Uxbridge R.A.F. Stadium as

an evening meeting in July but although many internationals have competed it has seldom attracted a crowd.

SEFTON BRANCKER TROPHY MEETING

Uxbridge, Sept. 17th

It was 25 years ago that Sir Sefton Brancker, instigator of this competition, lost his life in the R101 disaster. The meeting proved a close tussle throughout and the tide was turned in favour of the R.A.F. by Mark Pharaoh, who made a dash from London Airport on his return from Prague to win both shot and discus, the latter with a record throw of 158'4".

New records were also created by M. Harradine (Middx.), javelin 205'8"; and E. Stewart (RAF), high jump 6'2". Stewart is also R.A.F. Heavyweight Boxing Champion.

Ivan Mayer completed the 100yds. and 220 yds. "double" for Middlesex, whilst Roger Dunkley and Pat Ranger in farewell performances (they both leave the R.A.F. this week) filled the first two places in the 3 miles.

32-year-old Record Beaten

An English native record which has stood for 32 years was broken at the R.A.F. station at Uxbridge (Middlesex) last night when A. R. Cruttenden (Polytechnic H.) leapt 24ft. 3in. to win the long jump in the Sefton Brancker trophy meeting between the R.A.F., Middlesex, and the Civil Service. The previous record of 24ft. 2½in. was set up by H. Abrahams at Woolwich in 1924.

A sprint double was achieved by R. Sandstrom, last year's national champion, who won the 100 yards in 10.3sec. and the 220 in 22.6sec. D. Ibbotson, the British three-mile champion, finished last of six runners in the mile. The event was won by P. Clark (R.A.F.) in a meeting record time of 4min. 9.6sec. Ibbotson was off to a poor start and was last throughout.

Craig's Three Miles Win

Brian Craig, the British international 5,000 metres runner, successfully completed the second leg of an exhausting four races in nine days programme when he won the three miles at the Sir **Sefton Brancker** Memorial Trophy meeting at Uxbridge last night.

Craig broke the match record by over 16sec. with his time of 13min. 38.2sec.—running on his own for the last three laps—and now faces the Northern Counties six miles championship at Blackburn on Saturday, and an invitation 5,000 metres at the White City on Monday.

Another match record went to 19-year-old air cadet John Evison in the half-mile which he won in 1min. 52.7sec.

Civil Service lose—but win trophy!

THE Civil Service last night won the Sir **Sefton Brancker** memorial trophy at Uxbridge—thanks to a cross-country race AT THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR.

Although they gained only 93 points—six less than Middlesex—in last night's track and field events, the cross-country triumph gave the Civil Service an overall total of 130.

Middlesex finished second with 135, with the R.A.F.—holders for the past seven years—third with 117.

Civil Service star last night was Brian Craig, who smashed the three-mile match record by over 16 seconds with a time of 13 minutes 38.2 seconds.

Gerry Beaton, who is gradually regaining his form after his illness, had a double outing, again for Middlesex, finishing third in the 120 yards hurdles in 16.1 sec. and second in the triple jump with 44 ft. 2½ in.

CIVIL SERVICE END R.A.F. SUPREMACY

THE Civil Service ended a seven year reign by the R.A.F. when they won the Sefton Brancker Trophy at the R.A.F. Stadium, Uxbridge, on Wednesday, 2nd August, 1962. The last time they won the Trophy was eleven years ago.

The Civil Service went into the track and field events with an eleven point lead from the cross-country race held earlier in the year. It was a close and keenly fought contest that always held the interest and it was fitting that at the end only 13 points separated the three teams. Although they never relinquished the lead the third team, Middlesex, had whittled this down to one point.

Meeting records were broken in four events with the best performance coming from international Brian Craig. He allowed Derek Haith to build up a big lead from the start then relentlessly pulled him back and went ahead himself at the two mile mark with the time 9 mins. 9.6 secs. He then strode away, increasing his lead with every lap to win in the record time of 13 mins. 38.2 secs.

Conditions were not conducive to good times and this was reflected in the slow 10.2 secs. 100 yds., although most of the competitors regularly break events.

Ray Middleton and Peter Stapleford shook the Middlesex pair in the two mile walk by going quickly into the lead. Arthur Thompson and John Northcott hit back and it was continual battle all the way. Each time Thompson tried to pass, Middleton sprinted ahead and it was not until the last lap that the Middlesex man took the lead and held off a spirited challenge from Middleton at the final bend.

It was fitting that the Sefton Brancker Trophy should be presented to sprinter Orion Young by Mr. Les Golding, the President of the Middlesex A.A.A. and the England team manager. WITH a strong all round team Middlesex held off a gallant bid by the holders, the Civil Service, to win the Sefton Brancker Trophy at the R.A.F. Stadium, Uxbridge on Wednesday, 31st July.

The meeting was notable for good performances in the one and three miles. Peter Standen ran very confidently after recording 4 mins. 7 secs. on Sunday to record a very creditable 4 mins. 9 secs. in the mile.

In the three miles Ron Gomez found himself on his own. Jim Hogan, the Irishman with a mind very much his own, took one look at the track and refused to run as there were small pieces of glass on it. Hogan, who only runs barefoot, had no wish to emulate the Indian fakirs and confined his activities to training on the grass and giving verbal encouragement to Gomez.

Most of the evening there was only one point in it with, first, the Civil Service, then Middlesex in front. It was only when the last results came in that the county finally went ahead, their 163 points giving them a six point lead over the Civil Service with the R.A.F. third with 143.

MIDDLESEX won the two-legged Sefton Brancker Trophy at West London Stadium last week, beating the Civil Service and R.A.F. in a cliff-hanging finish which had everybody — athletes and spectators alike — at fever pitch.

The match result was decided on the last event — the javelin.

Ron Silvester, the Haringey and Southgate A.C. international, was leading throughout, but his teammate Enzo Devido (North London), was overtaken by two R.A.F. throwers, and dropped to fourth place which really put the cat amongst the pigeons.

However, the two Civil Service men failed to beat Devido's throw, and finished fifth and sixth, which meant that Middlesex had won the trophy by just half-a-point!

The county scored 146 points at West London, which, when added to their score in the cross country leg held last January, totalled 169 points.

Civil Service, who won the cross country leg with 46+

points, could only make 122 last week, and fell half a point short of the combined Middlesex total.

Haroun Korjie featured in a hat-trick for Middlesex, taking both sprints against sizeable headwinds and then helping his county take the sprint relay.

Mark Flint, AW's Road Runner of the Month, dictated the pace for all but the opening lap in the 3,000 metres, only to be overhauled by Larry Magleshot in the final 100m.

But, there was no such problem for Kevin Howard in the steeplechase, where he went ahead from the gun to win by 50m.

Despite winning half of the 20 events, Middlesex were narrowly beaten for the team honours. Fresh from their triumph over the Army in the Inter-Services championship, the Royal Air Force won on the night and, including the scores from the cross country match in January, ended the three-year run of success by the Civil Service to claim back this historic trophy they last won in 1989.

Proctor's effort of 19.44 compares well with his best of 19.67 set two years ago - although he has a 20.18 indoors to his credit - was the outstanding performance of this triangular meeting that dates back to 1931, one of the few trophy meetings to survive since the advent of the leagues.

Another field exponent close to his best was Puma TVH's Bill Beaumont whose hammer throw of 65.76 set Middlesex on the way to a match victory.

CITY CHARITY CONTEST, Mootspur Park 13th - 14th August

THE 29th contest for the "Financial Times Shield" deserved far greater support than was accorded to it for there were some excellent performances and keen finishes, with six records and one equalled, and a further "best performance" in "The City Mile". Moreover, there was a very close fight between the Banks and Business Houses before the former won the Shield by a single point.

Taking the track results in order of programme, the first record to fall was that in the steepclimb, whereas Ellis and Porter led from the start and finished in that order with the winner timed at 9 mins. and Porter 29secs. slower. For two laps, run in 60.6 and 63.4 respectively, the mile field was headed by Reed, Evans, Driver and Thorpe, but at the bell, Evans had dropped back to 4th with Linford 5th. The Tyrrian runner regained his placing in the next 100 yards, but could not retain it over the final furlong, during which Linford came up into third position though he failed to catch Reed and Driver who staged a fine finish. The Banks runner was beaten on the run-in in 4mins. 8.9 sec., but had the satisfaction of equalling the previous best of 4.09.0.

The heats had shown that the best low

hurdler was undoubtedly Hyslop (Tyrrian) and he was an easy final winner in 55.1, to clip one-fifth second off J. Davis's 1950 time. In the mile medley relay, Insurance improved upon their best of three years ago by three-tenths of a second.

The outstanding performance in the field was Smith's javelin throw of 212'7", which raised his 1955 distance by 12'9"; Lucking's 50'9" weight putt was the next best achievement and 3½" better than Savidge's 1955 putt. J. Sampson equalled his own discus throw with 143'8" in the discus, in which the Hungarian, Nage, was much below form.

Both sprints provided close finishes, but not as tense as the neck-and-neck races over the last twenty yards of E. J. Sampson and Burt in the quarter and Wild and Poole in the half. The two miles team race was won by the Tyrrians, whose scoring competitors, Richards, Gilligan and Dunkley, were always among the first six runners, though the individual honours went to O'Connor (Business Houses), with Richards second and Gilligan third.

The "City" Invitation Mile attracted a field of ten, who ran the first lap in 59secs, with B. T. Barrett and A. W. Lewis in the lead. In the second lap (61 secs) M. Berisford moved up behind Barrett in the back straight, but was passed by G. Knight before the completion of the half-mile, whereas A. D. Gordon was lying fourth. The Sale Harrier took the lead after 2½ laps, and at the bell (6mins. 4secs), Gordon was two yards behind him, followed by Barrett, Knight and Lewis. The leaders began to open up a gap in the last furlong and, entering the home straight, the Achilles representative made his challenge. There followed an exciting run-in, with Berisford just ahead until the last yard or two, when Gordon's final effort enabled him to get the verdict on the tape, both runners naturally being given the same time of 4mins. 5secs, which was 2.4secs better than G. W. Nankeville's record made at the White City in 1953.
