It is known from the contemporary Newspaper archives that Silver Trophies were presented to the winners of the CSAA Sports Day and up until the 1920's Silver Medals were being awarded to the winners. This document attempts to describe and illustrate some of the history of those awards and can be read alongside the Section on CSAA Medals. Whilst a number of Trophies are held at the CSSC Headquarters a number appear to have been lost through the passage of time, though even now one or two are appearing as a consequence of this history which is reward in itself.

From the Civil Service Sports Journal in April 1927 the announcement that Lord Queenborough had presented a cup for Athletics

AT THE MEETING of the Council held on April 7th, Sir Aubrey Symonds, who took the chair, introduced Lord Queenborough to the meeting. Lord Queenborough stated that he had great pleasure in presenting a cup to the Council for Athletics. He pointed out that he thought sport was very necessary for the good of the country and the splendid effect it had on increasing the efficiency of work. In reply Sir Warren Fisher thanked Lord Queenborough for his very generous gift. In receiving the cup Mr. Tomlinson also thanked Lord Queenborough on behalf of the C.S. Athletic Association and asked Lord Queenborough if he could find it convenient to attend the Annual Sports on June 11th and present his own cup to the winning department. Lord Queenborough promised that if it was possible he would attend.

The Table above details the winners of the Queenborough Trophy and is also a historical commentary on how Government Departments have transformed during this time. However, a clear theme running throughout this period is the strength of the HMRC and its predecessors of Customs & Excise and Inland Revenue. The only viable challenger has been DWP (DHSS) but even so it is 20 long years since they last lifted the Trophy. Originally the events comprised the Track & Field, Road Walking and Cross Country but over the years the following have been included – Road Relays, 10k Road, Half Marathon & the Masters Track & Field.

A VERY handsome cup has been presented to the Civil Service A.A.A. by the Marquis of Queenborough for competition, to mark the attainment of the Association's Diamond Jubilee Year of sport promoting thought to be unique in the history of English track athletics.
The "Queenborough" trophy, valued at over £100, is to be awarded to the "Victor Ludorum" department, both individual and team scoring to count. Points will be gained for the cup in track, road walking, and cross country championships of the Civil Service, both team and individual scores being added together to find the champion department.

As the Civil Service A.A.A. sports year runs from June of one year to June of the next, the cross-country championship of the Association last December will count for the "Queenborough" Cup.
For the past thirty years the C.S. A.A.A. has had a "Victor Ludorum" Cup for individual competition in the shape of the Diamond Jubilee Challenge Bowl. Fred Gaby, the A.A.A. hurdles champion, the present holder, has won the trophy in each of the past three years.

Other CSAA Trophies Competed for and Mentioned in Contemporary Reports but whose Whereabouts are lost in the mist of time.

Princess Mary Adelaide Award	The Award for Veterans was open to members of forty years and upwards and had been named by command in commemoration of Her Royal Highness' visits to the Civil Service Sports in 1879 and 1880. First competed for in 1882 for the 150 Yards Veterans Race it was reduced in 1906 to the 120 Yards Veterans Handicap but no mention made of the Trophy in the Results after 1901. Princess Mary died in 1897.	One has now been found out of the 20 presumably awarded
Bentley-Tomlinson Cup	First mentioned in 1908 competed for in the 100 Yards. Was it named after Harry Tomlinson, the 1874 100 Yards Champion and CSAA Sports Day Secretary 1878 – 1884 and J E Bentley who won the 3 Mile Race Walk in 1870 and was a Sports Day Race Walking Judge for many years.

During this research the very first Trophy awarded by Princess Mary Adelaide has come to our attention and the photos below reveal that it was in fact a Canteen of Cutlery. The prize was awarded in 1882 and Newspaper Reports of the time continue mentioning a Trophy until 1905 so it has to be assumed that each one was unique and that others still exist.

Engraving on Some of the Trophies held by CSAA/CSSC:

Diamond Jubilee Challenge Cup (instituted in commemoration of the Sixtieth Year of Her Majesty's reign). In 1901 the award was based on the "Scale of Points and Regulations" performances in nominated events which were: i) 100 Yards with the Winners in 1899 & 1990 penalised by 3 Yards; ii) the One Mile with the Winners in 1899 & 1990 penalised by 25 Yards; iii) High Jump which was open to Strangers as well as to Civil Servants by the invitation of the Executive Committee; iv) 120 Yards Handicap; v) 880 Yards; vi) Two Miles Walking Handicap; vii) 120 Yards Hurdle Handicap open to Strangers as well as to Civil Servants by the invitation of the Executive Committee; viii) Putting the Shot Handicap

It is likely that the criteria for the Award was amended over time when comparing the Challenge Cup Winners with the events they won on the day.
